ADVICE LETTER NO. 1406

TO THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

Pursuant to General Order 96-B and Decision (“D.”) 22-12-001, California-American Water Company (“California American Water”) (U210W) submits for filing and review this advice letter including the following tariff sheets applicable to its Monterey Service Area, which are attached hereto.

**Purpose:**

The purpose of this advice letter is to request the recovery of costs associated with the General Jim Moore Parallel Pipeline (“Parallel Pipeline”). Total capital cost for the project, excluding AFUDC, is \$7,420,371. The total cost for the project that will be included in rate base, including AFUDC through April 2023, is \$8,132,157. This Tier 2 filing is authorized by the modified D.22-12-001<sup>1</sup> (Application (“A.”) 21-11-024).

**Background:**

CAW submits this request to recover costs associated with the Parallel Pipeline pursuant to the authority granted by the California Public Utilities Commission (“Commission”) in D.22-12-001, Ordering Paragraphs 3, 10 and 11, as modified by D.23-03-048, which state:

3. California-American Water Company is authorized to construct and operate the following Company-related facilities: (1) extraction wells EW-1 and EW-2, and the chemical treatment facility; (2) extraction wells EW-3 and EW-4, and related piping; **(3) the General Jim Moore Parallel Pipeline** and the 1,100-foot section of the Transfer Pipeline; and (4) the Carmel Valley Pump Station. (Emphasis added)

10. Within 60 days after operation commences at any of the Company-related facilities approved in this decision, California-American Water Company shall notify the Director of the Commission’s Water Division by electronic letter indicating that the facility is completed and fully in service.

11. Within 60 days of notifying the Commission's Water Division of facility operation, California-American Water Company (Cal-Am) shall seek recovery of the costs of Company-related facilities up to the following cost caps using a Tier 2 Advice Letter: (1) \$16,723,704 for extraction wells EW-1 and EW-2, and the chemical treatment facility; (2) \$30,220,960 for extraction wells EW-3 and EW-4 and related piping, unless Cal-Am demonstrates by serving supplemental testimony in this proceeding within 21 days of the issuance date of this decision that a higher number is justified up to its requested cost cap of \$41,018,272 because ASR-5 and ASR-6 are the same wells as EW3 and EW-4 and/or work done for ASR-5 and ASR-6 is or will be used to design, plan, permit and/or construct EW-3 and EW-4. Intervenors will have the opportunity to serve reply testimony, and Cal-Am may serve rebuttal testimony according to the schedule set forth in this decision. The assigned administrative law judge will set a briefing schedule and/or a date for evidentiary hearings, if needed; **(3) \$8,264,655 for the General Jim Moore Parallel Pipeline and the 1,100-foot section of the Transfer Pipeline**; and (4) \$6,475,000 for the Carmel Valley Pump Station. Cal-Am's Tier 2 AL filing shall provide the following: (1) a description of the facilities that are used and useful; (2) whether the costs are reasonable; and (3) whether the facilities are appropriately sized. (Emphasis added)

On December 30, 2022, California American Water filed an Application for Rehearing of D.22-12-001, requesting the Commission correct certain errors in D.22-12-001 related to certain facility cost caps and AFUDC rates. On March 30, 2023, the Commission issued D.23-03-048 modifying D.22-12-001 and denying rehearing, as modified. This advice letter filing reflects modifications to D.22-12-001 related to the AFUDC rate applicable to the Parallel Pipeline. Specifically, in D.23-03-048 the Commission modified D.33-12-001 to state that the actual cost of construction is the appropriate AFUDC rate for the Parallel Pipeline.<sup>2</sup>

The Parallel Pipeline is a 7,100 foot - 36" ductile iron pipeline. The Parallel Pipeline improves California American Water's (1) operational efficiency of the Monterey Main System, (2) the operation of the Aquifer Storage and Recovery ("ASR") system, and (3) ability to perform simultaneous ASR injection through an existing pipeline and year-round extractions of stored PWM water, PWM expansion water, and ASR water. The approximately 1,100 feet of the Transfer Pipeline approved by D.22-12-001 is not yet used and useful and the cost of this portion of the Transfer Pipeline is not included in this advice letter filing.<sup>3</sup> This 1,100 feet of Transfer Pipeline will become used and

useful when additional extraction wells approved by D.22-12-001, i.e., EW-1, EW-2, EW-3 and EW-4, become operational.

### **Regulatory Requirements:**

#### Timing

D.22-12-001, Ordering Paragraph 10, directed California American Water to notify the Water Division's Director by electronic letter when the Parallel Pipeline is completed, fully in service, and operations have commenced. California American Water notified the Water Division Director on January 30, 2023 that the Parallel Pipeline met those conditions.

D.22-12-001, Ordering Paragraph 11, authorized California American Water to make a Tier 2 advice letter filing within 60 days of notifying the Commission's Water Division of facility operation. This advice letter is timely filed in accordance with Ordering Paragraph 11 and the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure Rule 1.15.

#### Costs

D.22-12-001, Ordering Paragraph 11, further authorized California American Water to seek cost recovery up to the cost cap of "\$8,264,655 for the General Jim Moore Parallel Pipeline and the 1,100-foot section of the Transfer Pipeline." Total capital costs for the Parallel Pipeline are \$7,420,371. Detailed capital costs are provided in Appendix B of Workpaper 400. Total project costs of \$8,132,157 requested for recovery includes estimated allowance for funds used during construction ("AFUDC") accrual through April 2023 consistent with the cost recovery timing proposed in this advice letter. The actual cost to fund construction is used to calculate the AFUDC, consistent with D.23-03-048.<sup>4</sup> Additional AFUDC accrued, as well as depreciation and property tax expenses incurred, prior to the effective date of the rate implementation will be tracked in the existing MPWSP Phase 1 Project Cost Memorandum Account.

D.22-12-001 provides a cost cap for the combined Parallel Pipeline and an 1,100 foot section of the transfer pipeline, however, as described above, and detailed in the project completion memorandum, the 1,100 foot of transfer pipeline will become used and

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useful for the delivery of water supplies (PM and PWM Expansion, ASR, and Native Seaside Water Rights) from the Seaside Groundwater Basin via Extraction Wells 1 and 2 and Extraction Wells 3 and 4. Without the 1,100 feet of transmission main, there is simply no connection to the Parallel Pipeline and thus no water delivery is possible from these facilities."

useful when the approved extraction wells are completed and put into service. When the 1,100 feet section of transfer pipeline is put into service California American Water will seek cost recovery, as applicable, using the \$844,284 remaining under the authorized cost cap and will seek recovery of capital costs over the cap, if necessary, through the next general rate case pursuant to the process outlined in D.22-12-001.<sup>5</sup>

### **Review**

D.22-12-001 sets forth three factors that are to be considered in review of this advice letter filing: (1) a description of the facilities that are used and useful; (2) whether the costs are reasonable; and (3) whether the facilities are appropriately sized. The Parallel Pipeline meets each of these factors as explained in the project completion memorandum provided as Workpaper 400 to this advice letter.

### **Revenue Impact:**

With this advice letter California American Water requests authorization to increase the revenue requirement for the Central Division by \$1,057,214, or 1.34% over the authorized revenue requirement adopted in Advice Letter 1404. This will provide for a total authorized operating revenue of \$79,787,920 for the Central Division. Rates will increase for the Central Division, including the Monterey Main, Bishop, and Ryan Ranch service areas, but excluding the Ralph Lane, Chualar, Ambler Park, Toro, and Garrapata service areas. Workpapers are provided as Workpaper 100.

### **Tier Designation:**

Pursuant to D.22-12-001, Ordering Paragraph 11, this advice letter is submitted with a Tier 2 designation.

### **Effective Date:**

California American Water requests an effective date of May 3, 2023. This effective date is more than 30 days from the date of this filing.

### **Notice:**

Pursuant to Section 4.3 of General Order No. 96-B, a copy of this advice letter is being provided to those entities listed in the attached "SERVICE LIST PURSUANT TO SECTION 4.3 OF G.O. NO. 96-B." This includes California American Water's standard Service List as well as the service list for A. 21-11-024. Anyone may respond to or protest this advice letter. When submitting a response or protest, **please include the utility name and advice letter number in the subject line.**

A **response** supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the advice letter. A **protest** objects to the advice letter in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds<sup>6</sup> are:

1. The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the AL;
2. The relief requested in the AL would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
3. The analysis, calculations, or data in the AL contain material error or omissions;
4. The relief requested in the AL is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or
5. The relief requested in the AL requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the AL process; or
6. The relief requested in the AL is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory (provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require relitigating a prior order of the Commission.)

A protest shall provide citations or proofs where available to allow staff to properly consider the protest.
