ADVICE LETTER NO. 1102-A

TO THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

California-American Water Company ("California American Water") (U210W) hereby submits for review this advice letter, including the following tariff sheets, attached hereto, which are applicable to all of its districts:

Purpose:

This supplemental advice letter addresses issues raised by DWA regarding the number of days in the prorated period of March 2014. It also includes an adjustment to commercial paper rates between November 2012 to February 2013 and April 2013 to July 2013.

This advice letter filing seeks review and approval for recovery of lost revenue in the Sacramento District due to the implementation of the voluntary conservation or mandatory rationing measures approved by the California Public Utilities Commission (Commission) in AL 1038-A. The adjustment in quantity revenue and production costs has been tracked in the Sacramento Voluntary Conservation or Mandatory Rationing Revenue Adjustment Mechanism Memorandum Account (VCMRRAMA), referenced on California American Water's preliminary statements as AZ.

Background:

California American Water filed and the Commission later approved Advice Letter 1038-A on March 26, 2014. The advice letter established, among other things, a Sacramento District Voluntary Conservation or Mandatory Rationing Revenue Adjustment Mechanism Memorandum Account. The creation of the memorandum account allowed the Company to track any losses in revenue due to voluntary conservation or mandatory rationing in the Sacramento District.

Per Attachment A of Resolution W-4976:

". . .Lost revenues associated with reduced sales as a result of activation of either Tariff Rule 14.1 or Schedule 14.1 for a utility without a full revenue decoupling Water Revenue Adjustment Mechanism (WRAM) should be tracked in a separate memorandum account for disposition as directed or authorized from time to time by the Commission."

Request:

California American Water requests that the \$3.3 million and accumulated interest, be transferred to the consolidated expense balancing account (CEBA) for recovery. The revised surcharge also reflects ongoing surcharge collections in the CEBA through September 30, 2015 and adjustments from the recently approved AL 1110.

The total requested recovery to be transferred to the CEBA, including interest, is approximately (\$3,290,832). Once transferred, the CEBA balance will be (\$1,717,220) or 3.24% of 2016 authorized revenue. Pursuant to SP U-27-W¹, memorandum account amortization surcharges have a sliding recovery scale depending on the percentage balance. Since the percentage is less than 5%, the spread will be over 12 months.

The surcharge would be levied on all general metered customers in the Sacramento District.

The actions requested in this advice letter are not now the subject of any formal filings with the Commission, including a formal complaint, nor action in any court of law.

This filing will not cause the withdrawal of service, nor conflict with other schedules or rules.

California American Water requests an effective date of January 6, 2016.

- 1. The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the AL;
- 2. The relief requested in the AL would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
- 3. The analysis, calculations, or data in the AL contain material error or omissions;
- 4. The relief requested in the AL is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or
- 5. The relief requested in the AL requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the AL process; or
- 6. The relief requested in the AL is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory, provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require relitigating a prior order of the Commission.
- 7. A protest may not rely on policy objections to an AL where the relief requested in the AL follows rules or directions established by statute or Commission order applicable to the utility. A protest shall provide citations or proofs where available to allow staff to properly consider the protest.

DWA must receive a response or protest via email (<u>or</u> postal mail) within 20 days of the date the AL is filed. When submitting a response or protest, <u>please include the utility name and advice letter</u> number in the subject line.

Cities and counties that need Board of Supervisors or Board of Commissioners approval to protest should inform DWA, within the 20 day protest period, so that a late filed protest can be entertained. The informing document should include an estimate of the date the proposed protest might be voted on.

REPLIES⁴

The utility shall reply to each protest and may reply to any response. Any reply must be received by DWA within five business days after the end of the protest period, and shall be served on the same day on each person who filed the protest or response to the AL.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS:

General Items:

- Qualifying low-income customers can receive a discount on their bill. Customers must apply
 with the Company for acceptance into the low-income program. For additional details, please
 see Tariff Schedule CA-LIRA.
- 2. Any customer paying for service at a premise where a Residential Fire Sprinkler System (RFSS) is required/requested to be installed by local fire and building codes shall be allowed to have their monthly service charge modified in accordance with the monthly costs for RFSS service charges. Provided, however, that the RFSS rate has been requested by the customer and verified by the Company that the smaller size of meter would be large enough to provide adequate service for the property in absence of the additional demand necessary to supply water to the sprinkler system. The RFSS will not be considered a fire service by the Company, but as an oversized general metered service. As such the rules and conditions of service for general metered service shall apply.

Fees and Surcharges:

- 1. All bills are subject to the reimbursement fee set forth in Schedule No. UF.
- Per Advice Letter 1072-B, a surcharge of \$0.0052 per hundred gallons will be applied to each bill
 to fund conservation efforts. The surcharge will remain in effect until otherwise directed by the
 Commission.
- 3. Per Advice Letter 1096, a surcharge of \$1.86 for the Low-Income Ratepayer Assistance Program ("LIRAP") Balancing Account will be collected from all non-low income water and wastewater customers.
- 4. Per Advice Letter 1102-A, the under-collected balance in the Sacramento District Consolidated Expense Balancing Account (CEBA) will be distributed through a quantity based surcharge of \$0.0166 per 100 gallons over 12 months effective from the date of approval of the advice letter. The total amount will be distributed to all classes of customers.
- 5. Water Revenue Adjustment Mechanism (WRAM) and Modified Cost Balancing Account (MCBA) Surcharge.
 - a. A surcharge is included in each bill to recover the net under-collection in the Water Revenue Adjustment Mechanism (WRAM) and Modified Cost Balancing Account (MCBA). For the period ending December 31, 2015, the net under-collection totals \$10,690,012 including interest. The surcharge is \$0.0504 per 100 gallons and will remain effective for 24 months beginning March 31, 2016.
